Greetings from Your President

Happy Spring! The birds are chirping and the flowers are beginning to grow. WZ members have been busy during the winter months. Most committees have met and have plans for this year.

- Our membership committee met in January, February, and March to work on a Membership dues Thank You refund. This \$10 refund is given by Western Zone to you when you continue your membership another year. It is also given to new memberships. Everyone that joins for the first time or extends their membership another year or more will receive \$10 for each yearly membership. This offer is for one year.
- Our Legislative Action Committee has also met during this time period. George and Marilyn Stephens and myself represented Western Zone at several RENY (state) zoom meetings. These meetings included representatives from our ten zones. The topics were centered around education and improvement of retiree's quality of life. The five legislative priorities decided upon are:
 - 1. Support the reintroduction of bills to protect retired public employees' health benefits under which we retired.

- 2. Support Governor Hochul's plan to rebuild NY's teacher workforce with an emphasis on recruiting and retaining teachers throughout the state to resolve the ongoing teacher shortage.
- 3. Support legislation to create an elder abuse registry, expand mandated reporting of abuse and increase training regarding elder abuse prevention.
- 4. Support increased mental health services for all students.
- 5. Support the Public Pension COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) computation formula to have older retirees receive a much needed pension increase.

Our Western Zone Legislative Action Committee sent letters, spoke on the phone, zoomed, and/or visited assemblymen and state senators during the month of March discussing these topics.

• The Teacher Grant Committee formerly chaired by Ron Czapla and now by Maria Hager led the committee to choose 2 schools that applied for these Grants of \$500 each. These grants involved students completing a project with their teacher(s). The article is in this Western Currents.


Health Information

Curious about CBD? Cannabidiol (CBD) comes from the hemp plant. It can be found in two forms, full-spectrum CBD and CBD isolate. The full-spectrum form can contain a small amount of THC, the molecule that produces a psychoactive or "high" sensation. CBD isolate does not contain THC, so it does not get the user high.

CBD is commonly taken to control pain and calm inflammation. It may be used to treat disorders of several body organs. It can be purchased in pill, oil, cream, and balm forms. Proper dosage is based on the user's weight and severity of symptoms. It is also pet friendly.

Reny/Western Zone 2022-23 Grant Awards

RENY/Western Zone awards two \$500 grants to teachers in public, private and parochial schools in our area (Cattaraugus, Chatauqua, Erie, Genesee and Niagara Counties) biannually. One grant is awarded for a teacher-generated classroom-related learning activity, the other for an out-of-classroom cultural presentation by students.

Alden Central School teachers Erin Griggs and Michelle Mattheus won the grant award for their proposal: "Struggling Reader Book Sets for Grades 3, 4 & 5" for the purchase of a series of books to improve the reading skills of upper elementary struggling readers by having a variety of books available at their reading levels. Several readers per skill level would allow students to engage in small group read-aloud instructions and to provide for independent reading instruction to increase decoding skills, to improve fluency and comprehension and increase interest in reading.

Ms. Griggs and Ms. Mattheus were recognized for receiving the grant at the WZ December board meeting. They were accompanied by their principal, Mr. John Mikulski. The Alden retired teachers in attendance were especially proud of these young professionals.



Middle Early College High School (a Buffalo public school housed at Bennett High School) teacher, Pamela Brown, envisioned presenting "The History of Step" with the establishment of a student-directed Step Drill Team, culminating in a cultural performance for students, staff and family members during Black History Month. Cross-cultural research involving the social studies, art and music departments would result in an audio-visual presentation. The award was used to purchase the boots required for the Step team.

The full "History of Step" program presented on February 14 highlighted the students showing the drill routines they created as well as other students sharing a slide presentation with the information



they learned from the cross-cultural classroom work, The program

was thoroughly enjoyed by President, Michelle Claus, and board member, Stan Nowak.

Congratulations to these excellent representatives of our profession!




