# **Opportunity Calls!**

Having retired from Glen Cove High School five years ago, I was looking forward to a new beginning, needed to stay busy and have a purpose. I wanted to volunteer but I wasn't sure what I wanted to do.

After some research, I came across "The Opening Word," a non-profit literacy and job training program run by the Sisters of St. Dominic, based in Amityville. I work three mornings a week teaching ESL to immigrant women who live in our Long Island community. While most volunteers usually teach only one morning a week, we are so short-staffed that I opted to go in three mornings and *I love it!* 

We are in dire need of volunteer teachers. It's a stress free work environment, lesson plans and materials are provided, and you don't have to be ESL trained. The program receives Federal and State funding accessed in part through Western Suffolk BOCES.

With 1-2 jobs, many of the women work overnight before coming to school each day with the desire to learn English and job-related skills like math and computer technology in order to become eligible for permanent US residency and citizenship.
